



Here are other great ways to help grow YOUR reader:

"Seasons and Weather"

Baby (0-12 months): Sing songs to match the weather or season. On a rainy day, sing "Rain, Rain Go Away." If it's snowing, sing "Walking in a Winter Wonderland."
