


ALBANY PUBLIC LIBRARY DAY May 21 (Sun) | 2-4 pm | Howe Branch

- ➤ A photo display of the library's many buildings and locations over the last 100+ years.



A LITTLE APL HISTORY

Our library has a long and varied history, which actually dates back more than 100 years.

- ➤ APL's origins began in 1833, when the Young Men's Association for Mutual Improvement in the City of Albany (YMA) formed and opened a member library a few months later.
- ➤ It wasn't until May 21, 1923, that the NYS Legislature created Albany Public Library, moving five libraries run by the YMA to city government.
- A year earlier, the YMA, which operated its library in Harmanus Bleecker Hall, as well as the John V. L. Pruyn Library on N. Pearl St., had taken over responsibility of the Albany Free Library, which operated libraries in the South End, Delaware, and Pine Hills areas as far back as 1891.
- ➤ After being part of city government for 79 years, APL then made another major change. On May 21, 2002, city residents voted to allow the library to re-charter for autonomy over its budget and operation, and board members elected by city residents.
- ➤ APL's most recent significant development was the complete renovation of three branches (Delaware, Howe, Pine Hills) and construction of two new branches (Arbor Hill/West Hill, Bach), all of which opened between November 2009 and June 2010.




Harmanus Bleecker Hall


John V. L. Pruyn Library

Traveling Library 1967-1982. Later replaced with "Big Purple Bus" bookmobile 2005-2010.

- Single-story, 12,000-square-foot library.
- 1st library building in neighborhood since Pruyn Library closed in 1968 and later torn down to build I-787 ramp.
- Received 2011 Outstanding Public Library Building Award from NY Library Association.

JOHN J. BACH BRANCH

455 New Scotland Ave.



- Newly built branch opened May 2010. Replaced small satellite branch in New Scotland Elementary School.
- Single-story, 8,500-square-foot library.
- Known for outside story garden.

DELAWARE BRANCH

331 Delaware Ave.



 Fully renovated former funeral home opened as branch in December 2009. Replaced small storefront branch in strip mall, also on Delaware Ave.

Single story, 9,500-square-foot library.

Received 2010 Outstanding Public Library Building Award from NY Library Association.

JOHN A. HOWE BRANCH

105 Schuyler St.



- Originally built as library in 1929. Fully renovated and expanded branch opened in March 2010. Pocket garden park added June 2016.
- Two-story, 12,000-square-foot library.
- Received 2010 Preservation Merit Award from Historic Albany Foundation. Received 2010 Historic Preservation/ Adaptive Reuse Merit Award from AIA Eastern NY Chapter.

NORTH ALBANY BRANCH

616 North Pearl St.



- New satellite branch originally opened November 2005. Fully renovated and slightly expanded branch opened October 2022.
- 2,800-square-foot library
- Now part of North Albany Middle School complex.

PINE HILLS BRANCH

517 Western Ave.



- Former telephone building with library branch on 1st floor fully renovated and expanded to 2nd floor, with reopening in November 2009.
- Two-story, 19,000-square-foot library.
- Received 2010 Historic Preservation/Adaptive Reuse Merit Award from AIA Eastern NY Chapter.

WASHINGTON AVE. BRANCH

161 Washington Ave.



- Former IRS building renovated and opened as library in 1977. Smaller-scale renovations 1990s-2010s.
- Two floors of four-story building house a 40,000-square -foot branch.
- Building also contains library district administration.
